

Top 4 Concerns from P4 Students



1.Exam anxiety: (Equipping students with skills to cope)

- Resilience Package (beginning of the year)
- FTGP 1-1 Interaction: channel for students to talk to their FT
- School taps on the expertise of the Senior School Counsellor to address students' emotional needs and provide psychological care



2. Completion of homework

- Too many commitments outside school?
- Allowance for them to submit their homework (e.g. students who were absent from school due to vaccination or CCA)

- 3. Relationship (Family Parents and Siblings/ Friendship)
- Social Skills Packages
- Peer Support Relationship
- Cyber-wellness Packages

4. Covid-19 (Safety)

- School Safety Measures implemented
 - Temperature Taking
 - Social Distancing
 - Personal Hygiene
 - Wearing of Masks
 - Bringing of Tokens
 - Emphasis on Social Responsibility



4 Tips to check in with your child about school



Children may not always voice out their fears or anxieties on their own. Make it a point to have regular conversations about what's going on in school and in their life, and make sure it's not just about their grades!

This will make it easier for them to open up when they are facing difficulties, and for you to pick up on what's troubling them.


Tip 1: Ask open-ended questions

Compared to 'Yes or no' questions, these can encourage your child to share more. If they are quiet, offer options.



Tip 2: Follow your child's interest

Talk to them about things that get them excited or chat about a school activity they mentioned. This shows you are interested in what they care about.



Tip 3: Problem-solve together

It's tempting to offer solutions right away when your child shares his problems. Instead, listen and ask them to think about how they will address the situation and guide them towards their own solutions.



Tip 4: Be a role model

Share your own thoughts to show it's ok to talk about one's emotions and worries. Explain how you deal with your problems, and encourage your child to find ways that work for them. I'm worried about my upcoming presentation too. Let me show you how I calm myself down beforehand using deep breathing.



Subject Based Banding

Subject-Based Banding (Primary)

Subject-based Banding (Primary) provides

- greater flexibility for students by offering them the option of Standard and Foundation Subjects
- depending on their strengths

This will allow students to

- focus on and stretch their potential in the subjects they are strong in while
- building up the fundamentals in the subject they need more support in



How does Subject-Based Banding work? At P4

- Student sits for school-based examinations
- Based on student's results, school recommends a subject combination
- Parents fill up an option form indicating preferred combination

How does Subject-Based Banding (SBB) work?

School recommends a subject combination based on the student's P4 overall examination results. Parents select preferred combination.

Performance	Recommendation
Passes all 4 subjects and performs well in Mother Tongue Language	4 standard subjects + Higher Mother Tongue Language
Passes 3 or 4 subjects	4 standard subjects
Passes 2 subjects or less	4 standard subjects; or
	2 standard subjects + 2 other foundation subjects; or
	1 standard subject + 3 other foundation subjects; or
	4 foundation subjects

Higher Mother Tongue Lessons

• Higher Mother Tongue lessons will be conducted once a week after school.

• The duration for each lesson is one hour.


Use of Higher Chinese Language for admission to SAP schools

- Students who obtained Distinction/Merit/Pass in HCL and a PSLE Score of 14 or better (i.e. PSLE Score ≤ 14) at PSLE will be eligible for posting advantage to SAP schools.
- If multiple students with the same PSLE Score apply for places in the same SAP school, those with better HCL grades will be allocated a place ahead of other students.
- This applies before the tie-breakers for S1 posting.

Using HCL for Admission into SAP Schools

Students who obtained a Distinction/Merit/Pass for HCL at the PSLE and an overall PSLE Score of 14 or better will receive a posting advantage when applying to SAP schools.

Students will be considered for admission to SAP schools in the following order:

How does Subject-Based Banding work?

At P5

Student sits for school-based examinations for subject combination chosen by parents

4 standard subjects

School will allow them to continue with the same subject combination in P6

4 standard subjects and has difficulty coping

School may allow him to take 1 or more subject(s) at foundation level in P6

1 or more foundation subject(s) and did very well in the subject(s).

School may allow him to upgrade to the subject(s) to standard level if school believes he can cope; or continue with the same subject combination in P6

Subject-Based Banding (Primary)

- Offering subjects at Foundation level is <u>not a disadvantage</u> to the students.
- It enables them to focus on building up strong fundamentals in these subjects and better prepare them for progression to secondary school.
