What are e-waste?

- Common types of e-waste include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Desktop, laptop and tablet computers, mobile phones, computer and mobile phone batteries, printers, peripherals and accessories such as keyboards, modems, monitors, computer mice, docking stations, hard disk drives, battery chargers, telephones, DVD players, cables and wires, etc.
 - Items that cannot be recycled include, but are not limited to, the following: Hazardous materials or liquids, ink and toner cartridges, alkaline batteries, etc.

Why are e-waste harmful?



 Improper disposal of e-waste leads to environmental pollution and this may in turn harm human health. The best way to treat e-waste is to recycle it properly.


 Recycling e-waste protects human and environmental health.

 Reducing the need for mining also lowers pollution, as the process of mining has an impact on our environment.


